CHAPTER PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

By the time the Treaty of Versailles was signed on 28 July 1919 over 4.7 million Americans had served in WW1. President Wilson proclaimed November 11th as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day..." Armistice Day November 11th, had giving universal recognition to the celebrated ending of World War I (The Great War) fighting at 11 a.m., November 11, 1918 (the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month). The day became known as "Armistice Day."

In 1954 the word "Armistice" was replaced by "veterans". It was not until 1968 did Veterans Day become one of four holidays designated as a 3-day weekend in the US, and on September 20th,1975 the Veterans commemoration was returned to the original date – 11^h month, 11th day, and 11th hour.

This past weekend several of our chapter members had the opportunity to take part in the Veterans Day celebration in Zephyrhills, Florida, to commemorate the millions of men and women who have served in our military services. The weekend was highlighted by a potluck dinner (with the park residence) with an opportunity to collect new toys for "The USMC Toys For Tots Program.", a reenactment of the war, and a parade which included local area participant floats and our Buccaneers float with a bevy of members walking alongside tossing candy to the crowd. I want to thank everyone who took part in the weekend. A great time was had by all.

Buccaneers gathered at the Palm View Garden Resort in Zephyrhills, Florida. This is a lovely campground, and we were the first group to "rally" at this park under the new management. Everyone went out of their way to make us welcome! Surprisingly, we were able to park close together, and the campground staff were very helpful in navigating a couple of their tighter spots. They gave us access to their large community room and full kitchen! We chose Zephyrhills as their military museum sponsors a World War II reenactment over Veterans Day.

We kicked things off with a happy hour featuring a tasty sandwich bar. We welcomed guests to this muster - Donald and Marsha Wiesehan as well as Taylor and Tom, grandchildren of Sean and Margie Haire. We hope they will all join us again. Returning members in attendance were Tom and Lynn Barrett.

Top game of the week - Five Crowns.

Following our chapter meeting, we assembled our Veterans Day Parade float. Everyone worked together to assemble the

benches and add the patriotic decorations. Jack Fritz provided the trailer and networked the loan of an Iwo Jima memorial display - flag included. Bill and Joanne Hastings donated 6 service flags to the chapter





which made their debut at this event. Having carried flags before, the quality of the


flags was apparent. The poles he selected were sturdy and lightweight making them easy to carry. We gathered again for lunch, then scattered to prepare for the evening's potluck. This wasn't just a typical potluck. We coordinated with the campground and about 50 residents - many veterans - joined us. Jack Fritz led a moving presentation of the Missing Man table. Our charity event for the season was the Marine Corps' Toys for Tots. The campground residents participated in this as well. As we left, they were





already calling to have the box picked up early and had partially filled a second one! We're sure the children in Pasco County will appreciate all the wonderful toys donated.

Following the potluck meal, Tom Barrett presented a fascinating talk on his experiences as a high-altitude reconnaissance pilot.



During three of the twenty-two years he served in the United States Air Force, he was a high-altitude reconnaissance pilot participating in some of the USAF's most secretive photographic and nuclear sampling reconnaissance flights.

Few aviation enthusiasts know about the aircraft he flew. Built in 1964 to replace U-2A and B models, this General Dynamics 122' wingspan RB-57F aircraft was designed to carry a pilot, systems operator, and the world's largest camera.

The camera was the size of a VW, weighed almost 6,000 pounds and could produce detailed photographs

of objects fifty miles away. Twenty-one Martin B-57s were built by General Dynamics. To minimize public speculation and maintain secrecy, the aircraft were never painted black and were given the same designation as an existing aircraft - the 65' wingspan.

Especially interesting are the missions flown taking samples of nuclear detonation "mushroom clouds" throughout the world. The campground residents and staff were blown away by his presentation.

On Veterans Day, we participated in the Zephyrhills Veterans Day Parade. The parade was less than one mile in length. We had a SMART banner in the lead carried by Lynn Barrett and Roni Fritz.







Cordell Vickers carried the Army flag, Tom (the Haire's Son-In-Law) carried the Marine

Jack Fritz, and Bill Hastings towed the float with the Iwo Jima memorial display and US flag, Sue Vickers, Tom Barrett, and Paul Moniz, rode the float and tossed candy - to the delight of hundreds of spectators.

The rear of the float had another SMART banner with the Buccaneers Outstanding Chapter streamers. Behind the float were the six service flags that were donated to the chapter by the Hastings. From left to right:

flag, Taylor (the Haire's granddaughter) carried the Navy flag, Joan Scheets carried the

Air Force flag, Sean Haire carried the Space Force flag, Margie Moniz carried the Coast Guard flag.










We had several members - Pam Faubion,

tanks and artillery demonstrations. When the demonstration was done, anyone wishing to collect expended brass was invited onto the field.











BYLAWS AND STANDING RULES UPDATE

Changes to our Bylaws and Standing Rules to permit charging muster fees were proposed at the September chapter meeting. The Bylaws change passed and has been forwarded to HQ for interim approval. A copy is now on the Bucs website.

The reason for the interim approval is that there are several additional, mostly administrative, changes that need to be made before the SMART BOD would grant full approval. We've asked HQ to grant interim approval with the assurance that we would submit a new change bringing everything up to date after our spring muster. Our chapter executive board will prepare and distribute new Bylaws for membership approval by March 22, 2024. They will be voted on at the spring muster.

Changes to the Standing Rules were also approved and, since they don't have to go to HQ for approval, are effective immediately. They authorize the chapter to pay the site fee for muster hosts at Buc musters. The stated purpose is to provide an incentive for our members to volunteer as hosts for future musters. The muster fee will be used to reimburse the chapter treasury for these incentives. At future musters, the chapter muster master and host are exempt from paying the muster fee. The new Standing Rules have been posted on the chapter website.
