CORN DOLLY

A Corn Dolly is a traditional English craft (and across Europe), made us-



ing wheat, oats, rye or barley, and is associated with a celebration of the harvest. They were thought to give the Spirit of the Corn a home to live in over the winter, as the corn in the fields was harvested, and are used as decorations in harvest festivals.

It also is sometimes called a Wheat Weaving and there are many different traditional designs. Starting with stems of wheat, then braiding them together, you will finish with a 5" ornament. Cost is \$5 per ornament.. Bring scissors and a towel. Supplies will be provided.

PATRIOTIC FABRIC CLOTH WREATH

A favorite place to hang banners and garlands is in the window. It really dresses up those patriotic holidays like Flag Day, Memorial Day, and



Independence Day. It's an easy DIY and always adds charm to your home. Join us in creating a 5 ft. patriotic garland. All materials will be provided. <u>Cost is \$10 per garland</u>. <u>All you need to bring is scissors and a towel</u>.



But there is more!

Each rig is welcomed to the campground by the travel committee. They first see a large **SMART sign** and a SMART member pointing the way into the campground. Other members direct them right into their campsite. This takes all the stress out of parking your rig.

Each travel meeting begins with a laugh from the Jokester. The weather person then forecasts the weather at the campground (and the people moan). Next comes the Fuel Report, complete with addresses, prices, and rig compatibility. And there is a report from the Mile-Post expert giving us points of interest and possible travel breaks. The gamester updates the animal sighting game and announces which games will be played that night. No other commercial caravan offers these extras.

The members provide organized Potluck meals under the direction of the tail gunner and her team leaders. These meals- and the happy hours are times to make lifelong friends. These friends cooperate with each other and the leaders to provide all these extras.



tion Park and their Historic Rail Park, along with Dueling Grounds Distillery. Time will be allowed to visit Mammoth Cave on your own.



The Great Atlantic Canada Maritime Experience





Bunker.






