Prayer and how God answers our prayers

Since there was just a handful of people that showed up to the chapel service in Amana, Iowa in September. I decided to write this month's article on the outline of that message.

The message was on the power of prayer and how GOD answers our prayers. One day I was out walking with our dog Nick, and I met a woman and we started to talk about our dogs. She asked me if I believed it was OK to pray for her sick dog? I told her yes because God was interested in what concerned us. We are His children. He listens to our request. Our prayers do not have to be about just spiritual things always but about our needs.

A few years back I rode a motorcycle everywhere I went by myself. If I went to church, work, or shopping. The Navy sent me to another city to be an adviser to a contractor on installing fuel cells in an H-3 helicopter. I was there for several days. After work on the last day, I decided to stop by and visit a friend before heading back home. Back in those days most gas stations did not stay open all night. As I turned into my friend's housing area, I saw a gas station and said to myself I will top off my tank there when I leave. Well, I stayed longer than I had planned, and the station was closed when I left his place. I rode by several stations, and all were closed. So, as I was going west on I-10 I prayed that The Lord would make my bike get better fuel economy than it had ever gotten before. As I rode on the bike started to miss fire, so I switched to my reserved tank, and prayed more and said you didn't make it get better fuel mileage, so I am leaving it in your hands to take care of this problem and I rode on. Soon the engine became silent, the only sound I could hear was my tires rolling on the pavement and the chain rotating on the sprockets. Up ahead I saw two trucks sitting beside the road. A pickup and a flatbed. I coasted between them and told them my problem. One of the men said they had problems of their own. The flatbed, which had a strand transmission, had a good battery but the starter was broken, and the pickup, which had an automatic transmission, had a good starter but the battery was dead, but they had no tools to change out the batteries. Riding a motorcycle, I always had tools, so we changed out the batteries and got both trucks running. Then loaded my bike onto the pickup and rode off down the road. A few miles down the road there was a truck stop that was open. Much farther than I would have wanted to push my bike.

Even though God did not answer my prayer the way I asked him to He did answer the way it needed to be answered. And He answered it exactly at the right time. If I had run out of fuel sooner, I would've had to push my bike. If I had run out of fuel later, I would have run past the two trucks. But instead, I ran out exactly at the right place.

Next month I plan to continue with Prayer and How GOD answers us.

Recipes from the SMART Cookbook Happy Hour Snacks

BACON CRACKERS

1 pkg butter crackers 8-10 slices bacon

(Townhouse or Club, either rectangular or oval) 1 c. brown sugar

1 pinch cayenne pepper 1 pinch ground black pepper

Heat oven to 350 Degrees F. Line baking sheet with parchment paper or aluminum foil. Align crackers on a wire rack. Slice the bacon to the size and shape of your crackers. Place a piece of bacon on each cracker. Sprinkle a generous amount of brown sugar (about a heaping teaspoon) on each bacon covered cracker. Lightly sprinkle with black pepper and cayenne pepper. Bake 15-20 minutes or until the brown sugar melts and bacon become crisp. Allow to cool on wire rack before serving.

CAJUN CRACKERS

1 lb. unsalted crackers 1 ¼ tsp cayenne pepper

2 oz. dry ranch dressing mix 1 ½ tsp red pepper flakes

(equals 5 ½ T) 1 ½ c canola oil

1 each 2-gallon Ziplock freezer bag

Combine ranch dressing, cayenne pepper, red pepper flakes, and canola oil in Ziplock bag and thoroughly mix. Add crackers and seal bag. Toss or turn bag to coat crackers. Continue every 15 minutes for 2 hours. Ensure each cracker is coated. Serve and enjoy.

RANCH OYSTER CRACKERS

1 jar butter flavored oil 16 oz oyster crackers

1 pkg ranch dressing


Mix oil and ranch dressing. Place crackers in Ziplock bag. Pour oil mixture over crackers and seal bag. Turn occasionally. When oil is totally absorbed, serve and enjoy.



IF YOU ARE THINKING ABOUT GOING ON THE WHISKEY & WATER CARAVAN, YOU MUST SIGN UP NOW. THE CARAVAN WILL BE CANCELLED AS OF NOVEMBER 13 IF THERE ARE NOT AT LEAST 15 RIGS SIGNED UP TO GO. YOU MAY BE HESITATING TO SEE WHAT THE NEW YEAR LOOKS LIKE, BUT IF YOU WAIT UNTIL THEN, YOU WILL HAVE LOST YOUR CHANCE TO GO. SIGN UP NOW.

This caravan will explore the science of making whiskey in Tennessee and Kentucky and the natural beauty of waterfalls across this same area. We will also visit several museums and attractions in the immediate area, We start just south of Nashville, TN where we will visit the grand-dad of all distilleries, Jack Daniels, followed by lunch at Miss Mary Bobos. You will have a chance to explore Lynchburg, TN on your own. At this stop, we will also travel into Nashville, tour the Ryman Auditorium, and take in a show at the new Grand Ole Opry. Additionally, we will visit one of the craft distillers of Tennessee, Leipers Fork, in Franklin, TN and Belle Meade, a historic family estate, winery, one time distillery and enjoy lunch on the veranda. Moving to the Bowling Green, KY area, we will visit the National Corvette Museum and the Corvette manufacturing plant. We will also take in the Bowling Green Aviation Museum, where docents provide a history of each of the fixed wing or rotating wing aircraft on display. There will also be free time to explore Mammoth Cave or the Lost Mine underground river, on your own. Also, we will visit Dueling Grounds craft distillery and learn the history of duels in the Franklin, KY area. Our next stop is Bardstown, KY, near Louisville. Here we will visit several distilleries and the Oscar Getz Whiskey Museum. One morning we will have breakfast at Churchill Downs racetrack and tour their operations behind the scenes. On Memorial Day we will travel to Ft. Knox and attend their Memorial Day activities. The Louisville Belle riverboat will host us for a lunch cruise on the Ohio river and we will visit Louisville Slugger baseball bat plant. The General George Patton Museum and Boundary Oak Distillery is also on our list of visits as well as Bernheim Forest, Jim Beam and The Old Kentucky Dinner Train. Free time will be provided to tour the local town and visit other distilleries of your choice. Our fourth stop will be in Frankfort, KY where we will visit several more distilleries and waterfalls in the local area, including Four Roses, Woodford Reserve, Buffalo Trace, and Castle & Emp; Key. A day will be spent in Lexington on the Thoroughbred Horse Tour. This includes several horse industry stops including a farm for retired race horses, and maybe a breeding farm, along with the significant history of the area and the thoroughbred industry. We will also visit Liberty Hall and the Rebecca Ruth Chocolate factory. Access permitting, we will visit the Kentucky State Capitol. The Capitol may still be under renovation still. Our final stop will be in the Daniel Boone National Forest, near Corbin, KY. There are several waterfalls in this area and depending upon your individual hiking abilities, you can visit several. We will have one day to visit the Cumberland Falls, which is called Niagara Falls of the south. We will take another lunch cruise on the Tennessee river and close out the caravan with dinner at a local restaurant. Come along and join us on this activity filled caravan. 
The Great Atlantic Canada Maritime Experience 2024

Civil War Chasing John Wilkes Booth Posting soon to the 2025 caravan list –

We have an interesting historical twist for this Civil War focused caravan. While the first shots of the Civil War were fired at Fort Sumter, the war began much earlier for John Wilkes Booth. Through guided tours and experienced docents, we will explore how Booth and his network of conspirators attempted to decapi-





tate the Union gov-

ernment and throw it into a state of panic and confusion. Our caravan will begin at Fort Sumter and end in Washington, DC, where five days after the Civil War ended, the assassin murdered President Lincoln.

We will visit some of the most significant sites where over three million men fought in America's brother-against-brother conflict that claimed more than 600,000 lives. While the war settled the question of Union versus States' Rights and ended slavery, not everyone accepted the outcome.

Sites we plan to visit include Ft Sumter National Monument; Manassas National Battlefield Park;

Richmond, VA; Antietam National Battlefield; Gettysburg DC, where five days after the Civil War ended, the assassin murdered President Lincoln. We will visit some of the most significant sites where over three million men fought in America's brother-against-brother conflict that claimed more than 600,000 lives. While the war settled the question of Union versus States' Rights and ended slavery, not everyone accepted the outcome.



Sites we plan to visit include Ft Sumter National Monument; Manassas National Battlefield Park;

Richmond, VA; Antietam National Battlefield; Gettysburg National Military Park; Appomattox Court House National Historical Park; Battle of Bentonville; and Historic Oakwood Cemetery. In addition to battlefield sites, we have chartered a private John Wilkes Booth Escape Route Tour! Our guide is a Lincoln Assassination historian and expert on all of Booth and Herold's haunts along their flight path. Our journey will begin at Ford's Theatre and continue as we visit Surratt's Tavern and discover where Booth hid his weapons. We will also visit Dr. Mudd's

Home for a guided tour of the farmhouse. This experiential tour is a must for Lincoln assassination buffs or those with an interest in Civil War history.

We will also include a variety of local activities and entertainment opportunities unique to the locations we will be visiting. We will end our caravan with an evening dinner cruise. We will enjoy delicious cuisine and live entertainment on a dinner cruise along the Potomac River and view the famous sites of the nation's capital — like the Washington Monument and the Lincoln Memorial.



Muster Master - Reese Burke.




