MUSTER SUMMARY

Our 2025 National Muster will be held in Mineola, Texas, with Opening Ceremonies on <u>Monday, September 15th,</u> and Closing Ceremonies on <u>Friday, September 19th</u>.



Place: Mineola Civic Center, 1150 N. Newsom St, Mineola, TX 75773, 903-569-6115

Registration Fee: Muster fee is \$250 per couple, \$140 per single, \$125 per guest. Cost includes catered meals, entertainment, and other muster activities.

Early Bird Prize: Register before May 1st and be eligible for the early bird prize drawing. Win the muster fee of \$250.

Camping: Camping fees are \$45 per night. Sites will be assigned by registration staff. **Bring water, sewer, & electrical extensions ...** Most electrical boxes have <u>ONLY</u> 50a and 15a outlets; 30a rigs <u>will need</u> a 50a to 30a adapter. - Some sites may require water and sewer hose extensions.

Earliest Allowable Arrival Date: Noon on September 10th. Muster departure date is no later than noon on September 20th.

Mineola, Texas, is located in Northeast Texas, 15 miles north of Tyler, The Rose Capitol of the United States, and half way between Dallas, TX and Shreveport, LA. The town, with a current population of around 4,823 people, was incorporated as the railroads arrived in 1873. A railroad official, Ira H. Evans, combined the names of his daughter, Ola, and her friend, Minnie Patten, to create the city name Mineola. It still has an Amtrak Station serving Dallas/Ft Worth. It is near Canton, TX, renowned for the world's largest flea market. While rich in history, Mineola is a modern refurbished town with many antique stores. Temperatures will be in the 80's during the day and 60's at night with a slim chance of rain. Mineola Downtown Historic District is home to a collection of buildings that were constructed between 1885 and 1960. The district comprises 88 properties and covers almost 23 acres (9.3 ha). It was added to the National Register of Historic Places on April 16, 2013.

TOUR #1: TEXAS FRESHWATER FISHERIES (September 11)

Built as a joint venture between TPWD, the <u>Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation</u> and the community of Athens, TFFC combines a Visitor Center, educational programming and a production freshwater hatchery. Developed on a 107-acre site, the facility includes 300,000 gallons of indoor and outdoor aquariums displaying dozens of species of native fish, waterfowl, alligators and amphibians in recreated habitats. A 14,000-sq.ft <u>conservation center</u>, completed in 2007, provides space for meetings and special events.

TOUR #2: EAST TEXAS OIL MUSEUM (September 12)

The purpose of the East Texas Oil Museum is to pay tribute to the independent oil producers and wildcatters, to the men and women who dared to dream as they pursued the fruits of free enterprise beginning in the 1920s. They were subsequently successful in discovering and developing the great East Texas Oilfield in 1930 and beyond. Tours are designed to allow visitors to understand what it was like to live in this part of Texas at that time. The museum houses traditional exhibit styles and also has a life-sized recreation of a town booming in oil named Boomtown.

TOUR #3: CALDWELL ZOO/ROSE GARDEN (September 13)

(lunch included) More than 3,000 individual animals from over 200 species live at the Caldwell Zoo. Many of the species at the Zoo are endangered or threatened in the wild. It is an 85 -acre zoo featuring animals from all over the world. At the Tyler Rose Garden, visit the world's largest public collection of roses. Explore the diverse rose collections, showcasing over 38,000 rose bushes representing approximately 600 cultivars. From classic hybrid teas to vibrant floribundas, each variety adds its unique charm
