

We visited two wonderful State Parks - Ellie Schiller Homosassa Springs Wildlife and Weeki Wachee Springs (home of the mermaids!). This was our first time visiting these parks and both are on our list for return visits. If you are ever in the area, we would recommend checking out El Mezcal Mexican Restaurant - twice a month they have a Mariachi Band, and we lucked out!



Ellie Schiller Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park includes



paved trails for wildlife viewing. The walk consists of elevated boardwalks that are accessible for visitors in wheelchairs or with strollers. The tree-lined boardwalk allowed an elevated view into the natural habitats and provided welcome shade from the sun along the way. They also had well positioned restrooms and benches for breaks. Most of the wildlife is native to Florida but they do have an African Hippo named Lu. Lu was declared an honorary citizen of the state of Florida in 1989 allowing him to remain at the State Park and today is the oldest known living African Hippo at 65 years young! All the wildlife is well cared for and occasionally a non-resident creature may stop by - like the large Pleated Redheaded Woodpecker who kindly posed for a picture.



Steve and Rita Bourque hosted a happy hour complete with bar, karaoke, and music trivia.




They started the evening with a humorous Sony and Cher skit singing “I got you babe” complete with wigs


