After the Tony Chachere's tour, we drove to the Louisiana Orphan Train Museum. The museum director, who is a descendant of one of the orphan riders, gave us a complete history of the riders who came to the area from the New York Foundling Hospital from 1854 to 1929. Opelousas was one of the many stops in Louisiana for trains bringing orphans to be fostered or adopted. The clothes and artifacts in the museum were incredible. Most of us were very unfamiliar with that part of Louisiana history.
