

Recipe from the Joint Muster, submitted by Joan Scheet

Overnight Breakfast Casserole (6-8 servings)

|                             |  |
|-----------------------------|--|
| 6-7 slices of white bread   | 1 lb sausage, cooked and drained                     |
| 1/4 cup diced green pepper  | 1/3 cup diced onions      1/2 cup sliced mushrooms   |
| 7 eggs                      | 2 cup milk      1/4 tsp salt    1/4 tsp black pepper |
| 1 cup grated cheddar cheese |  |

Cook peppers, onions and mushrooms until onions are translucent. Use 9 x 13 casserole dish. Layer in order the bread, sausage, vegetables, and cheese. Beat together milk, eggs, salt and pepper. Pour over the layered ingredients in pan. Cover with foil and refrigerate overnight. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes until cooked through. Jiggle it to test or put a knife in the middle to make sure. Serve with more cheese or hot sauce or any type of Mexican sauce if you wish.
