# A Message from your SMART President

I read an article that reported today's RVers have changed. They are younger and more wealthy. Their interests are different. They like to play pickle ball and ride their e-bikes. Many have children they have chosen to home school as they travel around the country.

The article made me think of all the ways our generation changed from our parents and how our children changed from us. Croquet, card games and lawn darts used to be popular activities. The roller-skating rinks and bowling alleys, once so popular among my generation, have closed. It's hard to find a drive-in theater anywhere today.

What does all this mean for us in SMART? It means we need to adjust and adapt as new members join our club. Card playing is ok but not what today's folks prefer to do. We need to update our games. Include corn hole, beanbag baseball, and trivia in chapter activities. Look for ways to include everyone in an event. No one should feel left out. Ensure games include everybody. Be sure to check in on each other. Follow up on new members to make sure they know when chapter musters are taking place. Offer to carpool. Be available to explain how chapter activities are conducted.

As chapters plan their calendar for the year, I ask you to think about new ways to recruit. How can we tell folks about this great club? One suggestion I heard was to join parades in your local town. On Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Veterans Day, look to be included in the town parade. We already have ready-made floats — our RVs! Put a banner on the front of an RV or have a few members carry a banner in front of the RV, wear SMART paraphernalia (hats, visors, shirts, etc.), and hand out those informative SMART booklets and applications. If your chapter is near a military base, put up a table outside the PX or commissary once a month. Members take an hour or two to staff the table, hand out information and answer questions. When the campground where your chapter holds a muster provides excellent service (giving a meeting room for no cost, providing military discounts, etc.), present them with a certificate of appreciation. There are so many ways in which we can spread the word about SMART. Let's commit to making this the year to break all records. I'd like to see everyone lined up to get the I GOT ONE pin at national this year. Better yet, let's induct some new members into the STAR chapter.

This leaves us to dream about places that have temperatures above 50 degrees, hence,

I have been passing the time this winter in a digital marketing program, hoping that I might be able to take some pearls of wisdom and apply it to SMART. While some parts of the program are technically based on the structure of a website domain (and thanks to the tireless efforts of Jack Fritz, SMART's website ranks high in quality construction), other parts of my program are more marketing centric. Digital marketing puts significant emphasis on getting and managing email addresses. SMART has a variety of email addresses that break out into three categories: participating members, members who have left SMART, and potential members who have not yet (fully) joined. To survive SMART needs to message each category a little bit differently in order for us to both keep and grow our membership.

Why did some members leave? A change in lifestyle? Personality clash? Simple oversight of not renewing? Perhaps someone is moving to another part of the country (think of our active-duty members). Permanent Change of Station orders are a fact of life, but it doesn't mean we have to lose them. Introductions could be made from an outgoing chapter to potential chapter(s) in the new location. If nothing is local, introductions to the non-geographical chapters could also be passed resulting in a win-win situation for both the member transitioning and SMART in general. I ask chapters to look at your email lists and look at your members: Are they active? Are they happy with us as an organization? If not, why not? Let's find out and see if we can keep them. Another category to consider is those who have not joined us yet. How many times have we heard from potential members "I have never heard of SMART". When we pass them one of our pamphlets or trifolds (you DO have some SMART recruiting information in your rig, right?), ask them for their email address.

We pass our email addresses to all sorts of organizations for discounts, freebies, or further information, so people have been conditioned to give their email addresses, so it's not as creepy as asking for someone's cell phone number. Our test program messaging would be similar, as candidates haven't fully joined yet and need to be encouraged to do so. Stay safe out there!! *B2*

The Rose Garden Center was a 1938 Works Progress Administration park project, and was mostly completed in 1941; but due to World War II, the center did not open to the public until 1952. In 1956, the lawn at the Rose Garden Center started hosting the Queen's Tea event, a part of the annual Texas Rose Festival. In 1992, they rebuilt the associated building and expanded its size, in order to home the Tyler Rose Museum. It is a 14acre rose garden with more than 38,000 bushes and at least 500 varieties, including 50 types of heritage roses. It is the largest public collection of roses in the United States. It is also an All-America Rose Selections (AARS) test garden.

It is one of the largest tourist attractions in Tyler, it is the location of the Tyler Rose Museum, and is part of the annual Texas Rose Festival in October. This will be one of the Tours at this years National, so please join us for a day in Tyler.





#### **INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE 1%'ers:**

INTERNET and GOOGLE were words that did not exist.

Newspapers and magazines were written for adults, and your dad would give you the comic pages after he read the news.

The news was broadcast on your radio in the evening. The radio network gradually expanded from 3 stations to thousands.

New highways would bring jobs and mobility. Most highways were 2 lanes and there were no Motorways.

You went to the city to shop. You walked to school and back.

Your parents were suddenly free from the confines of the depression and the war, and they threw themselves into working hard to make a living for their families.

You weren't neglected, but you weren't today's all-consuming family focus. (con't)

They were glad you played things like Fiddle Sticks, Cigarette Cards, Grab, Monopoly, Marbles, and Jacks by yourselves.

You entered a world of overflowing plenty and opportunity; a world where you were welcomed, enjoyed yourselves.

You felt secure in your future, although the depression and poverty were deeply remembered.

Polio was still a crippler. Everyone knew someone who had it.

You are the last generation to experience an interlude when there were no threats to our country.

World War 2 was over and the cold war, terrorism, global warming, and perpetual economic insecurity had yet to haunt life.

Only your generation can remember a time after WW2 when our world was secure and full of bright promise and plenty.

You grew up at the best possible time, a time when the world was getting better.
